Heaven #5 Details...details

I. Introduction

On many topics, God has been very specific and thorough as he describes and explains important biblical truths. For example, there is no ambiguity in scripture on how a person can deal with their sin "problem", and comes to have a personal relationship with an almighty righteous God.

1 John 5:12-13 "He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life. I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life.

However on the topic of Heaven, God has <u>not</u> spelled out every detail. He has used a broad "paint brush" with Old Testament and New Testament passages giving basic ideas, concepts and general truths. The details however, are found as we compare scripture with scripture and consider those details with an open mind. It is difficult to be dogmatic on each of these points.

II. In heaven, what will we know?

- A. Each other!
 - 1. We will have glorified bodies (Luke 24:39)
 - 2. We will have our names (Rev. 21:12-14 see the Apostles listed) (we get new names as well Isa. 62:2, 65:15, Rev. 2:17, 3:12)
 - 3. We will recognize others

Matt. 17:3 The Transfiguration

Luke 16:19-31 Abraham and Lazarus were recognized.

John 21:4-7 "Its Jesus, the one we've known...."

1 John 3:2 "Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when he appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.

4. We will be unique individuals (not a blob of clouds)

Luke 15:4-7, 10 Matt. 8:11 Matt. 26:29

- B. We will remember...
 - We'll remember "the good stuff" See the memorials... Rev. 21:12-14
 - We'll remember what God has done for us.Seeing Christ's scars will always remind us of His grace
 - 3. There seems to be some awareness of what's gone before. The martyrs in Rev. 6:9-11 knew about what had gone on before their death.
 - 4. However, "In eternity, past sins and sorrows won't preoccupy God or us."

We will marvel at His grace. We'll have a biblical not emotional perspective. "None of our loved ones will be in hell, only some whom we once loved." (Alcorn, p. 348)

Isa. 65:17 "Behold, I will create new heavens and a new earth. The former things will not be remembered, nor will they come to mind."

C. We will learn

1 Cor. 13:12 "Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known."

III. In Heaven, what will we be like?

A. We will have bodies Glorified and imperishable (1 Cor. 15:35-54)

- B. We will continue our racial distinctions (Rev. 5:9, 7:9)
- C. We'll wear clothes Robes (Rev. 3:4, 6:11, 19:13) With color sashes (Rev. 15:6)
- D. We'll probably speak one language (Rev. 5:9, 6:10)

E. We will have children among us

(Isa. 11:6-9)

F. We will not be angels

We will govern them

1 Cor. 6:2-3 "Do you not know that the saints will judge the world? And if you are to judge the world, are you not competent to judge trivial cases? ³Do you not know that we will judge angels? How much more the things of this life!"

- G. We will <u>not</u> be married (with those same kind of emotional/physical attachments) Matt. 22:30, Mark 12:25, Luke 20:35
- H. We will enjoy things (we will have some godly desires)

Eating: Luke 24:43, John 21:9-14

Fishing: Eze. 47:9-10

Ps. 37:4 "Delight yourself in the LORD and he will give you the desires of your heart."

I. There will be nothing unholy

Rev. 21:27 "Nothing impure will ever enter it, nor will anyone who does what is shameful or deceitful, but only those whose names are written in the Lamb's book of life."

IV. How many folks will be in Heaven?

Matt 7:14 "But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it."
