II. The Things You Have Already Seen

A. The Doxology vs. 4-6

Note the Trinitarian reference:

<u>From Him (God the Father)</u>: who is and who was and who is to come (time dimensions: past, present and future)

<u>From the (Seven) Spirit(s)</u>: A way to depict the fullness of the Holy Spirit. See Isa 11:2 and Zech. 4:1-10

From Jesus Christ:

- 1. A faithful witness (Rev. 3:14 and John 18:37)
- 2. The firstborn of the dead: In preeminence, not chronological order. There were resurrections in the OT (I Kings 17, II Kings 4, 13) and Jesus raised some in His ministry (Matt. 9, Luke 7, John 11).
- 3. The ruler of the kings of the earth. He is the absolute sovereign (Ps. 2:6-8, Jer. 23:5, Zech. 9:9). He has a name above all names! (Phil. 2:9-11)
- B. The Preview of the Second Coming vs. 7-8

"Behold": used 21 times in Revelation

"The Coming One "(the expected one): This is the theme for the entire book! The second coming is referred to some 500 times in the NT. Jesus spoke often of His own return (Matt. 16:27, Mark 8:38, Luke 9:26). And He warned His believers to be ready (Matt. 24:42, 44, Luke 12:40).

In MacArthur's *NT Commentary on Revelation* (p. 28-32), He outlines nine compelling reasons why Christ <u>must</u> return:

- 1. The promises of God require it (Gen. 49:10, Isa. 9:6-7, Da. 7:13-14)
- 2. His own promise requires His return (John 14:2-3)

- 3. The guarantee of the Holy Spirit requires His return (John 14:26)
- 4. God's program for the church requires His return (Rev. 3:10)
- 5. God's program for Israel requires His return: Jer. 33:25-26)
- 6. God's program for the unbelieving nations requires His return: Joel 3:1-7)
- 7. His own humiliation requires it (Phi. 2:10-11)
- 8. The judgment of Satan demands his return (John 12:31)
- 9. The expectation of the believers demands His return (I Cor. 15:19, Titus 2:13, II Tim. 4:8)

Notice who will see Him: it will be obvious to everyone: Jews: "those who pierced Him"-(Zech. 12:10) and the Gentiles ("all the tribes of the earth").

Notice too how He "signs" or authenticates this prophecy: The Alpha and Omega, the Lord God and the Almighty (Rev. 4:8, 11:17, 15:3)

C. <u>His Vision of Christ vs. 9-16</u>

- 1. As a 90-year-old man, "he was in the spirit" (on the Lord's day-Sunday): supernatural things were revealed to him. It happened to Ezekiel (2:2, 3:12), Peter (Acts 10:9), and Paul (Acts 22:17-21).
- 2. He is commanded to "write what you see..." This is the first of 12 times he is commanded to write in a book. On one occasion, he was told not to write what he saw (Rev. 10:4).

He is told to send it to the seven churches of Asia Minor. These were key cities in seven postal districts. It would be easy to distribute the letters.

- 3. His voice (verse 10): Like a trumpet blast, similar to Moses on Mount Sinai (Ex. 19:16)
- 4. The Vision Itself:

Son of Man in the midst of seven candlesticks:

Remember: Matt. 28:20 "I will be with you always, even to the end of the age."

- 5. Clothed in a robe: this is a term used mostly for the robe worn by the High Priest. (Heb. 4:14)
- 6. His hair (white) His eyes (like fire) and his feet (like polished brass): these are all emblematic of holiness. (I Peter 1:15-16)
- 7. His Voice (verse 15): the mighty roar of many waters (Eze. 43:2)
- 8. Seven Stars: The angels or messengers of the churches-these are likely the pastors of those congregations.
- 9. Out of His mouth: Judgment

D. The Effects of the Vision vs. 17-20

John fell at His feet like a dead man. Note the similar reactions of others who saw the living God: Isaiah 6:5, Ezekiel 1:28, 3:23, 9:8, Manoah (Samson's father) Judges 13:22 and Job 42:5-6

III. So What? Notice His Assurance to John (and us): verses 17-18

On the basis of His resurrection, he literally He says: Stop being afraid!
